Since 1949, the Community Foundation of the Fox River Valley has awarded more than \$14 million in scholarship awards.

The Community Foundation Scholarship Program consists of separate scholarship funds created by individual donors who establish the criteria for the administration of their scholarships. Such criteria must be consistent with overall Community Foundation policy.

General Policies

- Only one application form is required from any one student to be considered for all scholarships offered through the Community Foundation Scholarship Program. Students who submit an application form will be applying to the Community Foundation Scholarship Program as a whole, not for a particular scholarship, and will be considered for all scholarships in which they are eligible.

Please Note: Although an applicant may be eligible for several different scholarships offered, **only one scholarship will be awarded to any one student in any given year.** This policy is in keeping with the philosophy of the Community Foundation Scholarship Program to help as many individual students as possible.

- Students renewing a multi-year scholarship received from the Community Foundation for use during the 2018-2019 academic year will not be considered for an additional scholarship through the 2018 Community Foundation Scholarship Program.
- The Community Foundation of the Fox River Valley reserves the right to amend or to modify the scope of the Scholarship Program.

Primary Eligibility Requirements

- Eligibility is restricted to students who will attend an accredited institution of higher education within the United States of America on a full-time basis during the 2018-2019 academic year. Accredited institutions may include a two-year college, four-year college or university, professional/trade/vocational school, or graduate school.
- Eligibility is restricted to students with a permanent address* located within the Community Foundation service area unless the scholarship fund criteria designates otherwise.

* A person's permanent address is defined as the address used for tax returns, voter's registration, and other legal documents and correspondence. It is most likely NOT that person's address at school. For homeless students, parents, and families, or those living in transitional situations, this is the address at which these people can receive postal mail, such as a shelter or program.

Types of Eligible Applicants

• High School Seniors

- Students who will receive their high school diploma from a high school during or at the conclusion of the 2017-2018 academic year and are immediately continuing their education at the beginning of the 2018-2019 academic year.
- Students who will complete their high school education as a home-schooled student during or at the conclusion of the 2017-2018 academic year and are immediately continuing their education at the beginning of the 2018-2019 academic year.

• Undergraduate Students

- Students who have completed their high school education prior to the 2017-2018 academic year and are furthering their education at the undergraduate level of study at the beginning of the 2018-2019 academic year.
- Students who have obtained a General Education Development (GED) certificate prior to, during, or at the conclusion of the 2017-2018 academic year and are furthering their education at the undergraduate level of study at the beginning of the 2018-2019 academic year.

• Graduate Students

- Students who have attained a bachelor's degree and are undertaking advanced studies at the graduate level at the beginning of the 2018-2019 academic year.

Application Information

- Applications are available November 20, 2017 through February 5, 2018. Information at [2018 CF Scholarship Page](#).
- The deadline date for submission of a completed application form is February 5, 2018 by 4:00 PM CST. Late applications will not be accepted.
- Students who submit all required application materials will receive an email notification of the Scholarship Committee's recommendations in June 2018.

Types of Scholarships

- The majority of scholarships offered through the Community Foundation Scholarship Program are Traditional Scholarships, based on academic ability and financial need. Merit Scholarships, based on academic ability without consideration of financial need, are also available.

- **Traditional Scholarships** - Based on academic ability and financial need. Eligibility is limited to applicants who meet one or more of the following requirements.

- Students who will complete the 2018-2019 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and submit the resulting Student Aid Report (SAR).

The FAFSA is a form that may be submitted annually by current and prospective college students (both undergraduate and graduate) in the United States to apply for federal student financial aid (including Pell grants, Stafford loans, PLUS loans, and work-study programs). It is also used to apply for most state and college financial aid. (Submitting a FAFSA does not commit or require a student to accept financial aid offered from the U.S. Department of Education, a state, or a college). - Students who are currently participating in the National School Lunch Program through a high school.

The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) is a federally assisted meal program operating in public and nonprofit private schools and residential child care institutions. It provides nutritionally balanced, low-cost or free lunches to children each school day. Further information is available at www.fns.usda.gov/cnd/lunch/.

- **Merit Scholarships** - Based on academic ability. Financial need is not required. Eligibility is open to all applicants.

- The monetary value of each scholarship varies depending upon the available income in each individual scholarship fund.
- Scholarship awards are designated as one-year awards or renewable multi-year awards depending upon the scholarship fund criteria, as established by the donor of the scholarship fund.

Eligibility is limited to students who submit a 2018-2019 SAR or participate in the National School Lunch Program.

1.	HS U	AEEF Scholarship -Available to students pursuing studies within the fields of education. Reserved for graduates of East Aurora High School.
2.	HS	Nicholas R. Albers Memorial Scholarship -Available to students whose quality of life has been severely impacted by chronic pain due to a medical disability. Reserved for graduates of St. Charles North High School. Residency restriction expanded to include the portions of St. Charles School District 303 located within northern Kane County.
3.	HS	Claude L. & Alice E. Allen Memorial Scholarship -Available to graduates of East Aurora High School.
4.	HS U G	Edward & Gladys (Stoddard) Arenkill Nursing & Medical Education Scholarship -Available to students pursuing undergraduate studies within the fields of nursing, vocational medical training, or healthcare or to students pursuing graduate studies within the field of medicine. For those students pursuing undergraduate studies, preference will be given to students returning to school after a lapse of one or more years since the completion of their high school education.
5.	HS	Armbruster-Dieterich-Wagner Family Scholarship -Available to graduates of East Aurora High School who reside within East Aurora School District 131.
6. Reserved for residents of Batavia School District 101, East Aurora School District 131, Geneva School District 304, Indian Prairie District 2014, Kaneland School District 302, St. Charles School District 303, or West Aurora School District 129.

HS	Aurora Central Catholic High School Scholarship in Honor of Father Jerome Leake -Available to students planning to enter the seminary, to students pursuing a career in the area of religious life or social services, or to students pursuing studies within the field of education. Reserved for graduates of Aurora Central Catholic High School.

Preference will be given to students pursuing the combined fields of education and communications or theater. Reserved for residents of the City of Aurora who are graduates of a high school located within the Community Foundation service area.
